#### All persons must:

- put the welfare of Children and Young People first by encouraging a constructive

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## SEXUAL MISCONDUC

if the Young Person/s involved may be above the legal age of consent Children or Young People. Engaging in sexual behaviour while participating in our sport is prohibited even Inder no circumstances is any form of 'sexual behaviour' to occur between, with, or in the presence of

'Sexual behaviour' encompasses all actions that would reasonably be considered to be sexual in nature including but not limited to:

- Child or Young Person through prostitution; and 'contact behaviour', such as sexual intercourse, kissing, fondling, sexual penetration or exploiting a
- 'non-contact behaviour', such as firting, sexual innuendo, inappropriate text messaging, inappropriate photography or exposure to pornography or nudity.



# **POSITIVE GUIDANCE AND DISCIPLINI**

Australian Cricket strives to ensure that Children and Young People participating in our sport are aware of the acceptable limits of their behaviour so that we can provide a positive experience for all participants.

## ACTING APPROPRIATELY

All persons involved in our sport must act within the scope of their duties las determined by their role within their Affiliated Association or Club) when Alvolved in our sport.

Without express authorisation from a Nominated Supervisor or Person in Authority, all persons must not:

- provide unauthorised transportation to a Child or Young Person (see Transporting Children for
- engage in activities with Children or Young People who are participants and members of our sport outside cricket further information);
- engage in open discussions of a mature, adult or inappropriate nature in the presence of Children or Young People. programs and services;
- provide any form of support to a Child or Young Ferson or their family, unrelated to their role or our sport (for example, financial assistance, babysitting, providing accommodation), unless there is an existing social.
- personal or family relationship where providing such support would be appropriate in the arcumstances
- not seek contact with Children or Young People (or former participants) outside our sport including through online and social media
- take or store photos or foctage of Children or Young People except in accordance
- exhibit any type of fovouritism towards a Child or Young Person;
- of official awards or with the consent of the Child or Young Person's parent
- not, where there is no existing social, personal or family invitation to attend any private social function at the request of a Child or Young Person who has participated, or is participating, in our sport — or at the request of their family
- Any person that becomes aware of a situation in which a Child or Young Person requires assistance that is beyond the confines of that person's role or beyond the sporting environment, should undertake any or all of the following at the earliest opportunity:
- refer the matter to an appropriate support agency

## Language and tone of voice used in the presence of Children and Young People should:

- provide clear direction, boost their confidence, encourage or affirm them,
- not be harmful to Children or Young People in this respect, all persons should avoid language that is:
- discriminatory, racst, sexist, homophobic, biphobic or transphobic.
- intended to threaten or frighten; or derogatory, belittling or negative, for example, by calling a child a 'loser' or telling them they are 'too fat'
- profane or sexual.

## USE OF ELECTRONIC OR

All email, text messages and other messages, including group/fearn messages sent to a Child or Young Person should include their parent or guardian as well as to a Nominated Supervisor or Person in Authority or other contact nominated by the Affiliated Association or Club) of the Affiliated Association or Club,

#### Communication must:

- be restricted to issues directly associated with delivering our sport, such as advising that a scheduled event is cancelled;
- personal or social content irrited only to convey the message in a polite, and friendly manner. In particular,
- not be used to promote unauthorised 'social' activity or to arrange unauthorised contact. not include anything that may be perceived as being sexual in nature;
- not include a request for a Child or Young Ferson to keep a communication a secret from their parents, and not include a request to 'add as a 'riend', 'follow' or communicate with Children or Young People using

# LIVESTREAMING MATCHES INVOLVING

Clubs and Affiliated Associations should not livestream cricket matches involving Children or Young Feople unless they have implemented the necessary minimum child safeguarding precautions set out below

#### Take steps to mininise risk

safety related risks: Clubs and Affiliated Association implementing the following actions to minimize child

- avoid identifying the Child or Young Person by name alongside an ident fiable image/footage of their face, for example
- If your five-stream displays the scorecard or score and includes the name of the participating Child on face is not clearly visible; Young Person, consider positioning the camera far enough away so that the Child or Young Person's
- do not display photographs of the child alongside their name on the livestream.
- consider displaying the Child or Young Person's last surname or mittals only and not their full name
- limit access to the livestream to relevant people only by using private links or password protection
- limit the ability of viewers to download and/or copy the content from the platform.



## PHYSICAL CONTACT WITH

as assisting with bowling, batting or fielding techniques, when fitting cricket equipment and based on the Young Person) rather than on the needs of our personnel. needs of the Child or Young Person (such as to deliver first aid, or assist or comfort a distressed Child or any physical contact with Children and Young People must be appropriate to the delivery of our sport such

- other than as part of delivering medical or allied health service by a health care professional;
- is intended to cause pain or distress to the Child or Young Person for example physical punishment, would appear to a reasonable observer to have a sexual connotation;
- is overly physical (for example, wrestling, horseplay, tickling or other roughhousing);
- is unnecessary (for example, assisting with toileting when a Child or Young Person does not require assistance):
- is initiated against the wishes of the Child or Young Person, except if such contact is necessary to prevent injury to the Child or Young Person or to others, in which case
- physical restraint should be a last resort;
- the level of force used must be appropriate to the specific circumstances, and aimed solely at restraining the Child or Young Person to prevent harm to themselves or otners; and
- the incident must be reported to the Nominated Supervisor or Person in Authority as soor

any physical contact initiated by a Child or Young Person that is sexual and/or inappropriate, for example, acts of physical aggression, as soon as possible, to enable the situation to be managed in the interests of the safety of the Child or Young Person; all other participants and persons involved in our sport. All persons involved in our sport are required to report to the Nominated Supervisor or Person in Authority

# ATTENDING TO AN INJURED OR UNWELL

treat an injury. Any person administering first aid should do so in the presence of others. mly persons who are qualified in administering first aid or treating sports injuries should atter

### Other considerations include:

- the safety and wellbeing, comfort level and privacy of the Child and Young Person should always be
- only uncover and treat the injured area, ensuring the privary of the Child and Young Person at all times
- always report injuries and any treatment provided to the Child or Young Person's parent or guardian and document the incident notifying the Nominated Supervisor or Person in Authority; and
- If necessary, seek medical attention as soon as possible or recommend that the Child or Young Person parent or guardian seeks medical attention.



## **OVERNIGHT STAYS AND**

Overnight stays are to occur only with the prior written approval of the Norminated Supervisor or Person in Authority and the prior written consent of the parent or guardian of the Children or Young People involved. (consent can be obtained by online, digital or hard copy form or by electronic messaging such as email or SMS).

by the relevant State and Territory Association. Clubs and Indoor Centres unless such support for a Tour or overnight stay has been explicitly 'declared stralian Cricket does not support any Tours or overnight stays conducted by Affiliated Associations.

Practices and behaviour by all persons during an overnight stay must be consistent with the practices and behaviour expected during delivery of our sport at other times.

# Standards of conduct that must be observed by all persons involved during an overnight stay include

- ensuring that there is a record of attending personnel and a designated Tour manager,
- providing Children and Young People with privacy when bathing and dressing.
- no exposure to adult rudity; observing appropriate dress standards when Children and Young People are present – such as
- movies, television, the Internet or magazines; not allowing Children and Young People to be exposed to pornographic material, for example, through
- such as accommodation staff or friends; not leaving Children and Young People under the supervision or protection of unauthorised persons
- that would affect their ability to provide the appropriate level of care to Children &r Young People; attending personnel and "our manager must not consume alcohol, illegal drugs, or other substances
- ensuring that sleeping arrangements do not compromise the safety of Children and Young People by observing adequate adult to children ratios,
- ensuring that accommodation includes separate beds for all persons attending the overnight sta-
- not allowing Children or Young People to be accommodated without adequate supervision
- the right of Children and You uncomfortable or distressed during the stay; and ng reophe to contact their parents, or others, it they feel inisate
- parents expecting that their children can, if they wish, make contact.

## **CHANGE ROOM ARRANGEMENTS**

Children and Young People should be appropriately supervised while using change rooms. This requirement must be balanced with a Child or Young Person's right to privacy.

### All persons involved in our sport should:

- when supervising Children or Young People using change rooms, ensure that a minimum of two supervisors of the same gender as the group are always present in the change room.
- avoid one-on-one unsupervised contact with Children and Young People at all times in the change room (other than their own Child or Young Person):
- other members of the team in the change room; or Young Person) are present, unless the Child or Young Person is playing in a Senior team and there are not dress or undress in the change room while Children and Young People (other than their own Child
- Children and Young People in the change room: not take photos, videos or other recordings (or allow photos, videos or other recordings to be taken) of
- adults and Children and Young People using the change room, whilst recognising the right to privacy; and ensure a level of supervision for preventing abuse and general misbehaviour by members of the public



# USE OF, POSSESSION OR SUPPLY OF

People, must not: All persons involved in our sport who are delivering a program or service involving Children and Young

- use, possess or be under the influence of an illegal drug;
- use or be under the influence of alcohol whilst delivering a program or service;
- be incapacitated by any other legal drug such as prescription or over-the-counter drugs whilst delivering a program or service;
- any circumstance. supply alcohol or drugs (including tobacco) to Children and Young People participating in our sport in

Use of legal drugs other than alcohol is permitted, provided such use does not interfere with your ability to ovide the appropriate level of care to Children or Young People participating in our sport.

All persons should be aware of their relevant Alcohol, Drug Use and Smoking Policy which may include



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## TRANSPORTING CHILDREN

Australian Cricket acknowledges that from time to time there are valid reasons for transporting Children and Young People. Children and Young People are to be transported only:

- in circumstances that are directly related to the delivery of our sport:
- with the prior written consent from the Child or Young Person's parent or guardian and
- an acknowledgment of the Nominated Supervisor or Person in Authority of the parent or guardian's consent.

# Parental/Guardian consent must be provided in writing and must include the following information:

- the form of transport proposed, such as private car, taxi, self-drive bus, bus with driver, train or plane
- the reason for the journey;
- the route to be followed, including any stops or side trips
- details of anyone who will be present during the journey other than the personnel who are involved in delivering our sport; and
- vehicle and registration information, including insurance and full license held by drivers.

Written consent can be obtained by using an online, digital on hard copy form (you can use the Australian Crucket Parent/Guardian Transportation/Pick Up Approval as a template) or by electronic message such as email or SMS.

In the event that it is not practicable for the person to obtain prior written approval or consent, they must notify in writing the details of the travel to the Nominated Supervisor or Person in Authority as soon as practicable following completion of the journey.

When transporting Children or Young People, the driver must drive responsibly, must not be under the influence of any substance that may impair them cognitively, including alcohol, and must have a valid drivers' licence and, to the to the extent practicable, not be alone in the car with a Child or Young Person.

Children and Young People may or ly be transported in a vehicle when the manufacturer stated capacity is adhered to and seatbelts and child restraints must meet Australian Standards (AS/NZS1754).

## PICK UP AND COLLECTION OF CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

#### All persons must:

- make sure Children and Young People and their parents or guardians know the time and location of training and matches, including start and finish times:
- arrive before scheduled practice or game times to ensure that Children and Young People are not left unattended.
- have an accessible register of parent and guardian emergency contact numbers and an operational phone: ensure they are aware of alternative pick up arrangements for Children and Young People and that the parent
- or guardian has provided consent.

  ensure that if a parent or guardian is late, they make reasonable aftempts to contact them. It is not the responsibility of persons involved in our sport to transport Children or 'oung Feople horreff their parent
- or guardian is late for pick up:

  ask the second last Child or Young Person and their parent or guardian to wait until the final Child or

- Young Person is collected.

  not leave the training or match until all Children and Young People have been collected by their parents
- ask the parents or guardians to collect their Children or Young People from the club room if available

Australian Cricket Paront/Cuardian Transportation/Pick Up' approval forms for parents, specifying who may pick up their Child or Young Person from training and matches are recommended by Australian Cricket if in doubt, contact the parent or guardian before releasing the Child or Young Person into the care of a person other than the parent or guardian.

if a parent or guardian is repeatedly late for the collection of their Child or Young Person, the person responsible for the gonup should notify the Nominated Supervisor or Person in Authority



#### MONITORING AND REVIEW

This document will be reviewed annually, in consultation with stakeholders. Some circumstances may trigger an early review, this includes but not limited to legislative changes, organisational changes, incident outcomes and other matters deemed appropriate by Australian Cricket.
